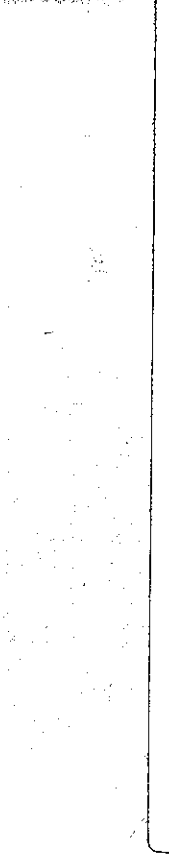

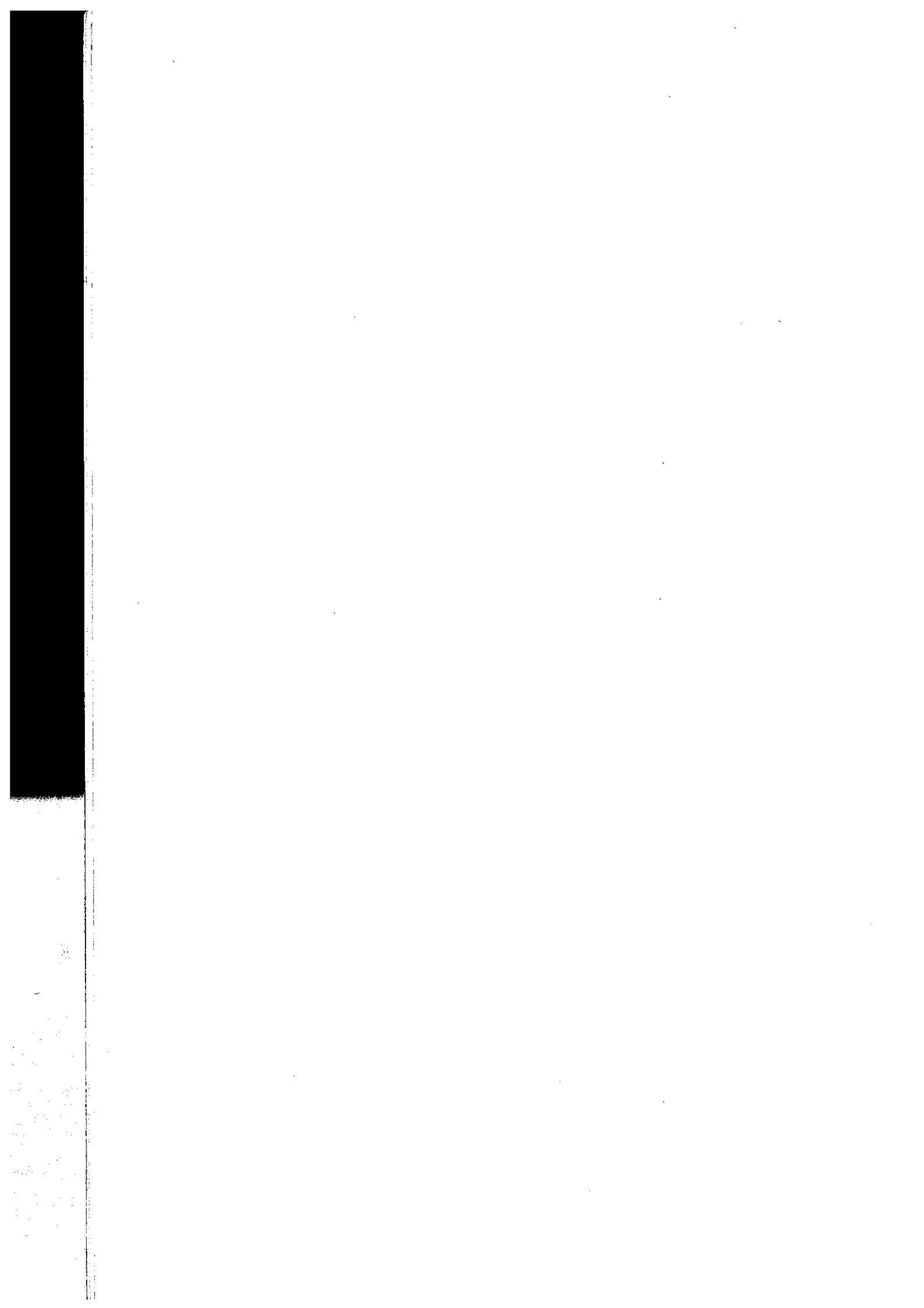

İKİNCİ A.B.D. GEZİSİNİN DÜZENLENMESİYLE İLGİLİ ACIKLAMA^{1/}

Türk Sanayicileri ve İş Adamları Derneği'nin (TÜSİAD), Kıbrıs konusundaki Türk tezinin Amerikan Kongresine ve kamu oyuna anlatılması için ilk defa 1975 Eylülünde düzenlediği programın devamı olarak 13 sanayici, 24-29 Nisan 1977 tarihlerinde Washington'da, 29 Nisan-2 Mayıs 1977 tarihlerinde New York'da temaslarda bulunmuşlardır.

Bu temaslarda Türk-Amerikan münasebetleri üzerinde yeni politika oluşturmakta olan Carter yönetiminin, ambargo ile ilgili tasarrufların Kongreye verilmesi arifesinde, Kongre üyelerinin aydınlatılmasına çalışılmıştır.

Heyetin Türk Hükümetiyle doğrudan veya dolaylı hiçbir ilişkisi yoktur. Heyet üyeleri birer Türk vatandaşı olarak Türkiye'nin haklı durumunu yansıtan görüş ve düşüncelerini Amerikalılara duyurmuşlardır.

A.B.D.'nde Kongre üyeleri, yöneticiler ve basın yayın organları temsilcilerine görüşme talepleri "Türk iyi niyet heyeti mensupları olarak" doğrudan yöneltilmiştir. Bu konuda TC Büyükelçiliği veya A.B.D. Dışişleri Bakanlığının aracılığına herhangi bir şekilde başvurulmamıştır.^{2/}

Temaslarda "Türk iyi niyet heyeti üyelerinin kişisel görüşleri" ortaya konulmuş, bu heyetin "Türk Hükümetiyle doğrudan veya dolaylı" hiçbir ilişkisi olmadığı, görüşlerin ve ifadelerin Türk Hükümetini bağlamayacağı bilhassa belirtilmiştir.

Temaslarda hiç kimseden veya hiçbir kuruluştan bir talepte bulunulmamış, sadece Türk kamu oyunun görüş, düşünüş ve bekleyişlerinin aktarılmasına çalışılmıştır.

Bu gezi için hazırlanan ve Türk ekonomisinin 1977 yılı itibarıyla durumunu ortaya koyan 299 sayfalık İngilizce bir yayın temas edilen çevrelere dağıtılmıştır.

Ayrıca New York Times ve Wall Street Journal'da yayınlanan ve örneği rapora ekli olarak verilen ilânlarla Türk ekonomisinin potansiyel gücünün Amerikan kamu oyuna duyurulmasına çalışılmıştır.

Highlights of the Turkish Economy -the fastest growing in the OECD.

Turkey's rate of growth, over the past five years, has been second to none amongst the OECD member states (and, over the past ten years, second only to Japan). This growth has been achieved, without the benefit of oil exports; by a free democratic society, co-operating within NATO and CENTO and moving towards full membership of the EEC.

- ✓ Average growth of GNP has been 7.1% in real terms over the last five years.
- ✓ Total industrial investment under implementation is in excess of \$30 billion.
- ✓ Industrial investment expenditure in 1976 was \$10 billion. The target for 1977 is \$12 billion.
- ✓ Of 1976 imports of \$5.1 billion, \$2.2 billion were for investment goods, \$2.7 billion for raw materials.
